Please don't lose sight of some of the things at "bluegrass" jams that should be

dear to your heart and make this type of experience so different from just listening to your favorite CD's and tapes over and over again. Bluegrass jams are PEOPLE...all kinds of good people having a real experience and enjoying themselves. Sometimes people venture a little from the old original "Bill Monroe" style. It might surprise you to find even many of the old Bluegrass original sometimes stray a long way from their usual style (of course you can skip those tracks or fat forward). But the point is people are sharing and caring and enjoying each other unlike any other medium I know of. Here in the Midwest our jams usually have break-out areas where almost any kind of music can eventually be heard. They are still called "bluegrass" jams. Our all nighters get really wild and sometimes downright silly by about 4:00 in the morning (Which is why I usually pack it in earlier but that is my choice. Others are having the time of their lives.) True, some direction is essential; but, be sure it's direction and not absolute control or you will spoil the spontaneous quality of a "live" jam! Then your jam just might—just might—get boring!

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## LUEGRASS IN REVIEW

### Ralph Stanley and Friends

In 1946, Ralph Stanley and his older brother Carter formed the Stanley Brothers. They performed together for the next 20 years and were instrumental in shaping bluegrass music. In 1966 Carter passed away but Ralph carried on with their music and has been doing

it now for over 50 years. The music of the Stanley Brothers has inspired thousands of musicians; and for this project, he is joined by some of the top names in bluegrass and country music who all wanted to do a duet with this influential artist. A long list of superstars grace this album, like Bob Dylan, who said "This is the highlight of my career", Patty Loveless "There is a specialness to his music" and Vince Gill "I learned just as much from Ralph Stanley as I did from Bill Monroe". Some of the top selections from this set include "Pretty Little Miss In The Garden" with Alison Krauss, Hal Ketchum's duet on "How Mountain Girls Can Love" and the reunion with Ricky Skaggs on "Shouting On The Hills of Glory".

This 2 CD collection covers just about all types and styles. Just like Stanley's "Saturday Night, Sunday Morning", it is an important cornerstone in the recorded history of bluegrass music.

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## MUSIC EDUCATION FOR FOLKS WHO PLAY BY EAR

Growing up in an extended Italian family, we sang for hours after Sunday dinner; my cousin John Sarno and I were expected to accompany the family on guitar or piano. We were fortunate to receive classical training as well, but our foundation was family songs played by ear.

A lot of folks have said to me, "I'm handicapped because I play by ear but can't read." Even more folks say, "I'm handicapped because I read but can't play by ear." As a music teacher, I teach both reading and playing by ear, including the rhythm, scales, chords, and arpeggios from which we construct tunes and accompaniment.

For the student who wants to understand music better, music theory—rhythm, scales, chords and keys—are a great course of study bringing "aha!" and the confidence that you understand what you're playing.

Each student presents a unique set of abilities. Are you gifted with a good ear for tuning and playing in tune? Can you sing in tune? What kind of music do you play? Can you play in rhythm? Do you learn a tune by ear? Harmonize by ear? Can you figure out an accompaniment by ear?

A student with a good ear can learn anything. If you play by ear and want to delve into the wealth of tunes written in the melody/chord form, you have a good motivation to read music. The basics take only a week or two; after that, you can read simple tunes and can move within weeks from simple tunes to col-

lections such as Celtic, old-time, waltzes, etc.

Learning tunes by ear is a great skill. Reading adds this potential: you can read through the great collections of traditional and composed songs, choose the songs you like, and interpret them yourself without the influence of another musician's interpretation.

I encourage students to become their own teachers. You are home free when you can learn any tune you want by ear or from the book. For some, this happens at age six, for some at age sixty. It's never too late, because music is a lifetime project.

My rule #1 as a teacher is "never bore the student; make music fun." As a humble person always studying and learning myself, I am a human who Makes boo-boos. It's today's oops! That shows us what to work on next. When we can chuckle at how our boo-boos sound, then get serious about what we need to work on next, all without heavy judgment, we've attained a healthy attitude about learning music.

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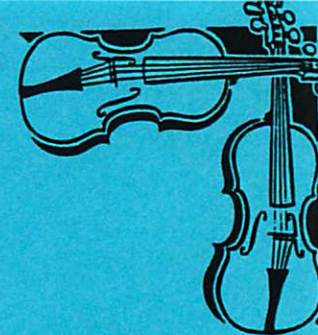
