Dede Wyland is a celebrated bluegrass and Americana singer whose career spans decades. A true trailblazer for women in bluegrass, Dede has paved the way for future generations in a genre long dominated by men. Her emotive voice, technical precision, and heartfelt delivery have earned her numerous accolades and the admiration of fans and peers alike.

Early in her career, Dede served as the lead singer for Skyline, a progressive bluegrass band featuring standout musicians Tony Trischka on banjo and Darol Anger on fiddle. Later, she collaborated with other luminaries in the bluegrass and Americana scenes, including Pete Wernick and members of the Johnson Mountain Boys.

Today, Dede performs with two groups that showcase her versatility:

- Big Howdy's Bluegrass Band: A progressive bluegrass group based in Washington, D.C., featuring virtuosos Randy Barrett, Ira Gitlin, and Tom McLaughlin.
- ☆ Dede & the Do-Rights: A band blending bluegrass with roots and country influences.

Beyond performing, Dede is deeply committed to music education. She teaches vocal techniques and bluegrass harmony in private lessons, workshops, and camps nationwide, including the beloved **Camp Bluegrass** at South Plains College in Levelland, Texas. Many of our members (myself included) have had the privilege of taking her classes there!

Dede also reaches students online through her **School of Voice** platform and her Peghead Nation course, *Fundamentals of Good Singing*.

Dede Returns to Tucson!

Dede Wyland is no stranger to Tucson. A few years ago, she hosted a vocal workshop here that drew over 30 eager participants, leaving everyone inspired. We are thrilled to welcome her back for an encore on **Sunday, February 9th**, at the **17th Street Music Club Room** (see flyer on the next page for details).

Yes, it's Super Bowl Sunday, but the workshop will wrap up before the 6:30 p.m. ET kickoff of the big game!

Dede's time in Tucson doesn't end with the workshop. She'll be in town throughout February and is available for private lessons or band coaching sessions. I can personally vouch for her expertise—Dede once helped my band perfect those close bluegrass harmonies, and the results were amazing.



Dede Wyland is a nationally known singer, recording artist, vocal instructor and eleven-time winner of the Washington D.C. Area Music Association's "Wammie" award for "Bluegrass Singer of the Year." Dede's career is the subject of its own chapter in Murphy Hicks Henry's 2013 book Pretty Good for a Girl: Women in Bluegrass (University of Illinois Press.) She has also been awarded a Master Artist, Bluegrass and Country Vocals certificate of honor by The Montgomery County Maryland Council of the Arts for her work as a voice teacher in the traditional arts.

Hi Bluegrass Fans,

It's time to review your DBA membership and to renew your membership if needed. In the Desert Bluegrass Association, we use a common yearly expiration date of March 1st. This allows us to focus on membership renewals once per year.

Of our 253 members, 153 of the memberships expire on March 1st. Your e-mail with this newsletter tells you if you need to renew. (If you receive hardcopy newsletters, we will enclose a note if you need to renew.) You may renew either from our website or by mail. To renew from the website, go to <u>www.desertbluegrass.org</u>, look for the "Join Today!" area (below the banjo cactus guy), select your membership length, and click the "buy now" button. To renew by mail, print and fill out the form in the newsletter, enclose a check made out to DBA, then mail it to the address listed. Either way is simple and easy.


You can renew yearly for \$20 or for 3 years for \$50. The 3-year option has real benefits – you save \$10 and you only have to deal with renewals every 3 years.

Becky Buller Band. Becky Buller has written

songs for Grammy award-winning albums by Molly Tuttle, the Infamous Stringdusters and the Travelin' McCourys. She has also written songs for Ricky Skaggs, Rhonda Vincent, Special Consensus, Doyle Lawson, Russell Moore & IIIrd Tyme Out, Kenny & Amanda Smith, Frank Solivan & Dirty Kitchen, and many more.

She is the winner of TEN IBMA awards, including the 2020 IBMA Collaborative Recording and Song of the Year for "The Barber's Fiddle" and "Chicago Barn Dance," respectively; the 2018 Gospel Recorded Performance of the Year for "Speakin' to that Mountain"; and the 2016 IBMA awards for Fiddler and Female

Vocalist of the Year (the first person ever in IBMA award history to win in both instrumental AND vocal categories as well as the first woman to win Fiddler of the Year).

Her new album, Jubilee, debuted at #1 on the Billboard Bluegrass Chart in June of 2024. She is surrounded by an amazing group of pickers and singers, including Ned Luberecki, 2023 IBMA Broadcaster and 2018 IBMA Banjo Player Of The Year. Ned is being inducted into the Banjo Hall Of Fame in October of 2024. Becky hails from St. James, MN, originally, and is a member of the Minnesota Music Hall of Fame. She now resides in Manchester, TN.

Never Come Down. Formed in 2017, Never

<u>Come Down</u> was born from the vibrant if not occasionally overlooked music scene of Portland, Oregon. Much like the city that inspired them, they're a smart, charming, off-beat amalgam of varied backgrounds and tastes. In today's paradoxical world where honoring tradition is often pitted against exploration and innovation, the band confidently walks the line between the modern and the tried-and-true. They've gained a loyal following and continue to win over audiences everywhere from Reykjavik's Iceland Airwaves to San Francisco's acclaimed Hardly Strictly Bluegrass. They've gained the attention of industry veterans, and toured in support of notable acts such as Yonder



Mountain String Band and The Travelin' McCourys, among others. Never Come Down's live performance never disappoints—with showmanship, originality, songwriting and musical prowess far beyond their years.

Never Come Down is a Portland, Oregon-based 5-piece composed of Joe Suskind (guitar), Crystal Lariza (vocals), Brian Alley (banjo), Kaden Hurst (mandolin), and Ben Ticknor (bass). Their dedication to thoughtful songwriting and dynamic arrangements highlight polished technical skills and a commitment to listening to each other.

The Blue Canyon Boys. The Blue Canyon Boys

are equal parts purists and innovators when it comes to Bluegrass: they stay true to the form's roots while constantly reimagining their relationship to tradition. Never settling for the same-old-same-old nor comfortable sitting back and going through the motions, the Blue Canyon Boys continuously quest for the song and the sound that drives their collective bluegrass spirit. The result is a toe -tapping mix of haunting standards, genre-bending arrangements, and catchy original numbers—all built on the bedrock of their collective bluegrass mastery.

Ever since founding members Jason Hicks and Gary



Dark launched the Blue Canyon Boys in 2003, the Blue Canyon Boys have raised the bar for bluegrass bands. They bring it all: seamless brother-duet style, crisp instrumentation, unvarnished lyrics and subversive humor. After winning first place in the 2008 Telluride Bluegrass festival band contest, the Blue Canyon Boys went off at full tilt, taking the bluegrass circuit by storm, performing in illustrious venues across the country as well as internationally. The seasoned quartet features Gary Dark on mandolin, Jason Hicks on guitar, Drew Garrett on bass, and Chris Roszell on banjo. Their latest album, aptly titled "7", is perhaps their most polished and poignant yet. Classic bluegrass, clean and raw, blends effortlessly with the band's home-grown compositions, then peppered with a judicious cover or two, such as the band's riveting take on Warren Zevon's "Carmelita".



The Country Gentlemen Show. Few

names in the bluegrass world are as celebrated as The Country Gentlemen. Their harmonious blend of traditional and contemporary styles has made a lasting impact on the genre. Today, <u>The Country</u> <u>Gentlemen Show</u>, composed of talented musicians, carries the legacy of honoring the original band's music and spirit.

This band is not just a cover band; they are a tribute in the truest sense. They don't merely replicate the songs; they breathe new life into them. With

members like Mike Phipps on vocals and guitar, Lynwood Lunsford on banjo and vocals, Dave Propst on mandolin and vocals, Darren Beachley on Dobro and vocals and Taylor Parks on bass and vocals, the band brings a wealth of experience and passion to the stage.

While the band honors the past, it also looks to the future. Their latest album "Yesterday and Tomorrow" is a testament to this, featuring new, original material that stays true to the style of the original Country Gentlemen. This project, especially poignant following Bill Yates's passing, shows the band's commitment to evolving while respecting the roots from which they grew.

The Country Gentlemen Show is more than just a musical act; they are the custodians of a rich musical heritage. They ensure that the music of The Country Gentlemen continues to resonate with current fans and reaches new ones. If you're a bluegrass fan or just discovering the genre, following The Country Gentlemen Show is a journey through the heart of American musical tradition. Their music is a bridge between the past and the future and a ride worth taking.

Cisco and the Racecars. <u>Cisco and The Racecars</u>

specializes in bluegrass, folk, and old time Americana music. Their energetic style and diverse arrangements and instrumentation create a unique blend of old and new. Under the management and vision of Francisco Briseno, Cisco & The Racecars has taken its place as one of the premier bluegrass bands in the Southwest.

The band is composed of Francisco Briseno on banjo, Mark Hickler on guitar, Giselle Lee on fiddle, Chester Carmer on mandolin, Katie Carmer on cello, and Joelle Tambe-Ebot on bass. Francisco, an Arizona State Banjo Champion, has gathered his band members over many years and together they've formed a highly unique and authentic sound. Although their roots are bluegrass, and they remain true to that tradition, they

also play popular, country, and old-time music. The band plays festivals, special events, parties, weddings, and members also arranged and played 35 performances for the world premier theater production of "Burning in the Night".

In addition to performing, Cisco & the Racecars mentors the young players of the <u>Jam Pak Blues 'N' Grass Neighborhood</u> <u>Band</u>, a local after school music program that gave several of the band's members their start.

In summer 2018, the band had the opportunity to tour Ukraine, playing concerts in villages and towns across the country. This musical diplomacy trip was arranged by the Peace Corps and generously funded by the Trust for Mutual Understanding and the American Embassy in Kiev.. Cisco & the Racecars returned to Ukraine in summer 2019 for a second tour. They look forward to future opportunities to travel the world, share their music, and promote international understanding.

North of Lonesome. North of Lonesome

is an Arizona-based bluegrass band with deep roots in traditional bluegrass music. They've also been known to veer off into grassed-up soft rock and blues, to the edge of folk and old-time music— but always with that bluegrass vibe.

You'll find yourself humming and swaying to the growing list of songs they've written for themselves. So wax up your mustache, grab your sweetie, and be ready to dance.

You'll hear Scott Lewis on resonator guitar, Alan Lister on guitar and vocals, Kate Fox on bass and vocals, Mike Seymour on mandolin, and Luke Stucklein on banjo.

Permafrost Road. Permafrost Road was originally started by three former Alaskans who wound up in Tucson. Permafrost Road features Billy Paul on banjo, Jon Kinnaman on mandolin and guitar, Ken Brown on guitar and dobro, Dan Mullin on upright bass, and John Adams on fiddle.

Permafrost Road played the Casa Grande Bluegrass Festival (2023) and will be performing at the Desert Bluegrass Festival in Marana on March 8, 2025. They have played at the Gaslight Music Hall in Oro Valley twice, most recently in November of 2024.

While traditional in structure, Permafrost Road plays a wide variety of songs and tunes from the Americana, Bluegrass, and Classic Country music repertoires, plus some Irish fiddle tunes.
